May Membership Activity

The May 2022 membership activity is a visit to Rick Garthe's layout in Texas Corners area (see directions below) on **Saturday, May 28** ^{th.}

We will meet for breakfast at **The Colonial Kitchen Pancake House**, 330 N. Drake Rd., Kalamazoo. The back room is reserved beginning at **nine o'clock** for informal breakfast. The Colonial Kitchen is in the same building as AT&T and Art Van's Pure Sleep on the east side of Drake Road in the block south of Main Street. The restaurant faces south in that building.

We will begin with an informal breakfast (on your own) with business meeting to follow at **9:30 o'clock** then, we will travel to Rick Garthe's home to view his layout.

Greetings from Rick Garthe

Hi all! On May 28th Division 9 of the NMRA and guests are invited to my home/polebarn layout. I though I would provide some information of the layout and a list of events for the visit.

I plan on having signs at my driveway entrance to aid people in finding my house at **6737 Texas Drive, in Kalamazoo, MI 49009**. It is near Texas Corners. Sometimes GPS will guide you to the house across the street. My house is on the same side of the street as Texas Drive Park. My house is white with gray trim, with a two rail fence on the road boundary, and a wind mill in the yard. Feel free to park on the grass of the right loop of my drive. My layout is in the green polebarn behind the white garage. If you have mobility issues feel free to drive on the yard right up to the polebarn entrance. I will have a red lantern at the entrance.

Some notes about the building are as follows; it is $36' \times 72' \times 10'$ tall insulated polebarn building, heated and cooled with an open loop geothermal system. The layout room is $34'5'' \times 47' \times 10'$ tall, with the balance of the building being my woodworking shop. Access is through one of three (3) entry doors or a garage door.

The layout is on short nap carpet, most of the carpet is repurposed or remnants, which explains the four (4) different carpets colors/patterns.

The theme is agriculture with no prototypical modeling, except generally in the Great Lake/Mid-West, or by accident.

The layout has five (5) different scales; Lionel, O gauge, S gauge, HON3, and is mostly HO gauge. The following items/specifications are on the HO part of the layout. The bench work is single deck, 37'' to 39'' tall, that has 1×3 white pine boards made into $30'' \times 48''$ rectangles with 1'' or 2'' foam insulation glued on with liquid nails adhesive to the 1×3 's. The switch count is as follows: 77 switches, which 48 are #6 Fast Tracks, four (4) 3-way switches, three (3) double

slip switches, one (1) double crossover, one (1) single crossover, six (6) wye, eight (8) curved of which three (3) are Fast Tracks. There are also five crossovers. The track is code 100. I use mostly Atlas flex track and some fixed radius Atlas track. The track is mostly silver-nickle, but there is some brasses mixed in too. The count of these items was not confirmed, which means the numbers are close to correct but most likely off a bit. The layout is under construction so the numbers could change.

Currently there are about 155 structures and bridges on the layout. Most are Walters plastic kits. There are some kit bashed, custom, and craftsman kits.

Some of the features are a dinosaur ranch, ferry boat that will list if loaded incorrectly, a hump yard, open pit mine, a small drone that will fly out of the Area 53 mountain, drive-in movie, a pink submarine in a pond, and a CNW passenger car mural incorporating a glass window that use to be in a CNW car. Please remember, the layout is a work in progress, not all of these features are working as planned, yet.

Each engine is battery powered with the following specifications; a 250ma, 11.1v, lithium polymer (LiPo), which lasts about 1.5 hours per charge. I place the battery and the switch in an ore car with an extension cord going between the engine and ore car. Each battery kit is \$75 from Deadrail Installs. Once you contact the owner he is very helpful, but he is very difficult to connect with. (http://deadrailinstalls.com/dead-rail-installation-kits/)

I am using LocoFi to deliverer instructions between the router, controller, and engine. The LocoFi board installs like a DCC board. The LocoFi board includes a speaker with a generic diesel engine sound. The sound can be changed, but I am too lazy to do this and the sound is good enough for me. LocoFi uses an Android phone for a controller. A person can go to the Google Play store and download the LocoFi app for free, updates are also free. I was able to do this correctly the first time. Which is very unusual for me. The LocoFi board is \$112 or lower if you use your NMRA discount, buy more than one (1) at a time, and send them the DCC board you replaced the LocoFi board with.

(https://www.wifimodelrailroad.com/) Service and help from LocoFi has been GREAT!

So. my plan on Saturday is to have a mini scavenger hunt to fill in the time for the different arrivals and for people to explore the layout. Then I will give a lecture (including Q & A) about the layout – it's history, design concept, general guiding principles, and tour. I will have chairs and hopefully the lecture will not be too painful. Sorry, no quiz after the lecture. For those that wish we can run trains. Smoke stack dispatch, just run trains from one place to another and do some switching. I currently have four (4) running engines, hopefully more by the time of the tour.





Details at Trooper by Dave Vinci

Small areas of your layout can become a whole lot more interesting with just a few added details. In this case, I added a flag stop on an outside curve where there would have been no activity. All it took was a platform, a passenger shelter, a grade crossing, a watch box, and a handful of figures.

This drawing is of a typical Passenger Shelter used by the Pennsylvania Railroad. It is available on-line in several locations but I used this one as a reference.







The platform is made from 0.040" thick sheet styrene and painted a concrete color. The watchman's box was scratchbuilt from the scrapbox. The grade crossing sign looks like the illustration at right. You can keep it interesting by changing the vehicles and figures from time to time.

OCTOBER 2022 MODEL RAILROADING CONVENTION - KALAMAZOO/BATTLE CREEK, MI AREA

Registration location(s) on Friday will be announced after you register, registration on Saturday will be at the location where the clinics are being held from 7:30am to 12:30pm. The building is northeast of the Kalamazoo Amtrak Station and backs up to the train tracks.

Oct 28, Friday evening, there will be a gathering of model railroaders for dinner at Clara's Restaurant in downtown Battle Creek starting at 6:30pm. You need to reserve a spot for this event and dinner will be ordered off the menu with individual bills. Who knows what might be scheduled for education, entertainment and fun!

Oct 29, Saturday, at the River Church, registration from 7:30am to 8:30am and time to visit with other model railroaders. Free donuts, coffee, and soft drinks!

Oct 29, Saturday, 8:30am, 9:45am and 11am. 12 clinics will be presented between four different rooms.

Oct 29, Saturday, Lunch on your own. Then more model railroad layout viewing 1:00pm to 4:30pm, maybe operating sessions on Saturday evening.
