Officer Reports – there were no officer reports as the main topic of this meeting was to update everyone on the status of the October 28^{th} & 29^{th} Kalamazoo Train Convention.

Rich Mahaney provided an update on the following convention related issues

- · Rich indicated that everything is going well so far
- Convention fliers have been distributed to train clubs, local area hobby shops and the Grand Rapids Train Show that will be held in October.
- Signs for layouts & Operating Sessions have been made and will be distributed in the next few weeks.
- Jim Glenn won't be able to run an Operating Session, however, he will be able to have the Layout tour at his home on Friday Evening (October 28th).
- Rich will pick up 5 projectors, giving us one backup as we only need 4.
- Rich asked for a volunteer to pick up one of the projectors from Rich at the WMRR membership meeting and deliver it to the Convention. Alan Bau volunteered.
- We have total of 9 registrations so far. 8 from the website and 1 mail-in.
- Dinner count is up to 8 for dinner.
- Casey Bartman indicated that the dinner presentation will be a zoom presentation.
- We will need Joel to make arrangements for the zoom link.

- We need a projector for the dinner meeting.
- Clinic presenters & layout owners are registered for free.
- Rich to send out a memo to presenters & layout owners regarding their registrations.
- Rich asked board members to bring the following items to the convention.
 - TV Trays or Card Tables Alan Bau indicated he can get 4 card tables from the Kalamazoo Bridge Club.
 - Coolers
 - Small Tools

NCR ONE DAY (really two!) MODEL RAILROAD CONVENTION KALAMAZOO/BATTLE CREEK, MI

The NMRA NCR Division 9 is hosting an NCR OneDay Model Railroad Convention over two days (OCT 28/29, 2022) which will include layout tours, clinics, a special dinner and hopefully some operating session, all of this is over a Friday afternoon through Saturday time frame. The location is in the Kalamazoo and Battle Creek area of Michigan. The Kalamazoo Model Railroad Club will be hosting their Annual Fall Train Show and Sale on the Sunday (Oct 30) of that weekend if you would like to attend that also. A weekend of railroading activities. Hotel selection in the area is on your own.

Registration location(s) on Friday will be a will be at the first layout at 3:30pm in Galesburg. You can view the layout and pick up registration related materials. Registration and clinics on Saturday will be at **The River Church**, located at **517 Walbridge, in downtown Kalamazoo**. The building is northeast of the Kalamazoo Amtrak Station, and their parking lot backs up to the train tracks.

Oct 28, Friday afternoon, there will be layout open houses from 3:30pm to 6:00pm. You must have a paid registration and convention badge to see the layouts. Registration for the convention will occur at the first layout on the tour.

Oct 28, Friday evening, there will be a gathering of model railroaders for dinner at Clara's Restaurant in downtown Battle Creek starting at 6:30pm. You need to reserve a spot for this event and dinner will be ordered off the menu with individual bills. Who knows what might be scheduled for education, entertainment and fun!

Oct 29, Saturday, at the River Church, registration from 7:30am to 8:30am and time to visit with other model railroaders. Free refreshments and some breakfast foods during registration and the clinics! Clinic times are- 8:30am, 9:45am and 11am. 12 clinics will be presented between four different rooms. Lunch on your own. Then more model railroad layout viewing 1:00pm to 5:00pm, operating sessions on Saturday evening. 11 layouts will be open for viewing on Saturday afternoon.

Clinic Descriptions:

1. Mark Cowles - "BOATS FOR TRAINS"

The clinic provides ideas for how boats and railroads intersect with photos of the prototype and of how other modelers have incorporated into their layouts. Emphasis is on, but not limited to, the vessels of the Great Lakes. A number of models will be available to view, and a handout will be provided.

2. Greg Bueltmann – "STAYIN' ALIVE: INSTALLING KEEP ALIVE CIRCUITS IN DCC LOCOMOTIVES"

Keep alive circuits allow DCC equipped locomotives to traverse dirty tracks or unfriendly turnouts without stalling or restarting the DCC sound on the engine. These circuits will be explained, and installation techniques reviewed.

3. Steve Harsh – "ADVENTURES IN SCRATCH BUILDING A SMALL TURNTABLE"

The presentation will explore the various options available for acquiring a small turntable. The various steps involved in scratch building a small turntable will then be illustrated including the wiring and control of the turntable. Also, to be shared is knowledge gained, mistakes made and the cost of construction.

4. Rich Mahaney – "BIG PIPES, AN INDUSTRIAL FACILITY DETAILING ADDITION"

Many industries use large pipes on the outside of their buildings to move solids, liquids, and gases. This is an item that you can add to your industries for an interesting detail and addition. These pipes actually come painted in a variety of

colors, which can make them standout. Rich will share images through his photography to give you many examples and ideas.

5. Barry Hensel - "THE CLOSET EXPANSION"

In The Closet Expansion, Barry explains how he found more room for another town and industries on his Reading Lines - Central Division HO scale layout. Working on this project was spread-out over a 2-year period, but it has recently been completed! This is an interesting look at using space that one might not feel is usable.

6. Norm Logan - "DEVELOPING OPERATIONS FOR YOUR RAILROAD"

There are many books on Train Operations, but none for "YOUR RAILROAD" business. Mr. Logan will discuss how to look at YOUR Railroad and develop traffic, rail car use, and crew handing for all sizes of layouts. Discussion of OPS sessions will also be included.

7. Steve Harsh - "CONSIDERATIONS IN LIGHTING STRUCTURES"

The presentation explores some reasons for increased interest in lighting structures and some of the commercial options available for lighting structures. The focus will be on methods and considerations if using the "do-it-yourself" method including power supplies, bulb selection for different purposes, distribution systems, wiring, lighting control and the newer technologies available. These methods and considerations will be illustrated with actual installations.

8. Bob Blake - "MODELING MOTION"

Model locomotives and DCC decoders have become much more sophisticated during the past decade. Much of the focus has been on new features including road specific details, lights and sound effects, but they also include much better motor control allowing smoother, more prototypical operation. Modelers can take advantage of this to provide much more realistic operation.

Ralph Moxley and Jim Shirreffs – "BUILDING THE ANN ARBOR RAILROAD LAYOUT"

Ralph and Jim built Jim's Ann Arbor Railroad in Jim's basement going from Cadillac to the Elberta boat yard and ferry in MI. Ralph built many buildings and scenes as he remembered and traveling to the area for details and photos for use in modeling. Recently built are the "Boat Landing Scene" and the "Marine Office Building" which have been displayed in MI and will be brought for display at the convention. Jim will talk about building the "Michigan Forest Look" for the layout and the use of the product "Magic Water" to make the lakes and rivers.

10. Ron Christensen – "MODELING BULK OIL DEALERS FOR YOUR LAYOUT?

Ron has spent many hours studying and photographing bulk oil dealers over the years. This presentation looks at his findings and how these facilities where in most communities to serve the local gas stations with fuels and oil to sell. Many of these facilities were serviced by the local railroads. This presentation will give you ideas for "scratch building" a facility or improving your "Walthers" kit if you bought one.


11. Maynard Mitchell - "BUILDING MY C&NW LAYOUT"

Maynard will share some of his incredible techniques for building his layout, track, scenery, and buildings to give the realistic looks that he is known for.

12. Bill Neale - "UPGRADING AND REFRESHING A LAYOUT (...or What I Did During the COVID Shutdown)"

Simple upgrades can make a big impact on the appearance and operation of your layout. This presentation details the improvements I have made to my layout over the past year or so. Most of these improvements can be applied to your layout, and can really improve your enjoyment of the hobby. This clinic includes: fascia & backdrop painting, layout lighting, control systems and the addition of a fully operational signal system.
