

November Membership Meeting





Here are a few Poultry car photos from my collection - Dave Vinci




The first live poultry car was patented in 1884 by William P. Jenkins and James L. Streeter. Jenkins was a traveling freight agent for the Erie Railroad and Streeter was a poultry dealer in Muncie, Indiana. The drawing is crude, but the car they built revolutionized the hauling of poultry via rail.






These cars were definitely advanced at the time they were built. Many of the cars were built in Indiana at car shops in either Michigan City or Terre Haute. Drawing from The Railroad Car Journal, January 1893.






Sometimes called "cackle cars" for obvious reasons, live poultry cars were undoubtedly noisy and smelly places. 



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Here are a couple of photos from the Dinner Presentation on Friday night about this all aluminum bodied rail car. That is the old Michigan Central Depot in Battle Creek, Mi. This was the **Clark AutoTram**. It was an Aluminum rail-car powered by a 16 cylinder Cadillac Engine. The styling was very Art Deco both inside and out. The wheels were made of a rubber product by the Firestone Corp (I know they were rubber, believe Firestone) that were encased by steel tires. The top speed recorded was 73 mph, although ads placed in the trade magazines listed over 100 mph. It never ran on track that would allow such speeds. - Casey Bartman
