<u>March 16th - Layout Tour & Op Session</u> - 6850 Herbison Rd., De Witt Mi.

The program for the day starts out with a tour of Andy's layout, followed by an Op Session on his layout.

The following is a report on the February Clinic at the Kalamazoo Bridge Club as reported by Rich Mahaney.

On Saturday, Feb 17, 2024, Division 9 had a wonderful informative meeting on Andy Keeney's model railroad layout called "The Nashville Road" and how Andy conducts operations on his layout.

Ron St. Laurent, and Craig Rosenberger, part of Andy's operating crew, also added in comments during the presentation. Andy started his presentation describing how his railroad layout was designed and track plan was laid out. Andy's track plan was designed for "operations", which is Andy's favorite part of model railroading. The railroad is in a space that measures about 48 ft by 56 ft.

Andy has planned out his industries and determined how many railroad cars can be delivered to each industry, the frequency of set outs and pick-ups, and the use of car cards. The railroad operates in the 1950's and is centered with Nashville, TN. Trains run north and south of Nashville. Bowling Green, KY is on the north end of the layout, Columbia, TN is at the south end. There are a number of different railroads that operate on the layout. Andy's triple deck layout will operate some 30 or more trains in an operating session. Being in the 1950's, both locomotives and diesels move trains. Andy's likes to operate his railroad during and operating session with 15 to 20 people. The railroad uses NCE throttles with its DCC system,

Andy, besides sharing a PowerPoint presentation on his railroad, it's design, it's operations and it's concepts compared to real railroads, Andy also brought samples of the paperwork that is used during operating sessions to explain and pass around. We had a nice turnout of people for the meeting and presentation at the Kalamazoo Bridge Club facilities! Thanks Alan Bau!

In March, Division 9 members are invited to learn and practice their railroad operating skills at Andy's house and operate on his layout between 10am and 2 pm on March 16th in the DeWitt area of Michigan (northwest of Lansing). Andy's home address is 6850 W Herbison Rd, DeWitt, MI. Join us on March 16th at and on the "Nashville Road". People coming should plan on bringing a lunch and fluids to drink, since the trains must keep on running, "there is a schedule to keep"! The "Nashville Road" is the Chicago, Indianapolis, Nashville and Southern







A new series of bridge classes is planned to start on Thursday April 11th at 2:00 PM. There are 6 - two hours sessions.


Rich's Travels
