



# **Recap of April Membership Meeting**

# Doug Harding made his usual terrific presentation **titled** "Fun with Pickles" a look at the pickle industry.



Doug Harding presented a great clinic, that was also very interesting. Doug shared with Division 9 a history of the pickle industry. From harvesting cucumbers, transporting cucumbers to the facilities with the salting tanks, the grading by size, onto the making of pickles to the putting into jars and can.

The pickle industry is and was a large industry in Michigan. West Michigan had a number of locations with pickle operations. Doug showed photos of pickle facilities in Holland, Bangor and Lacota. There are still pickle facilities (Freestone) across from the Amtrak passenger station in Bangor. The Holland Heinze plant was once known as the world's largest pickle factory. The factory now mostly produces relishes. The is some interesting historical information on the internet about how the area farmers came up with a plan to build the plant, the need for land on Lake Macatawa, and the need for rail service. You can see the railroad tracks winding through Holland to the Heinz plant on the old Sanborn insurance maps that can be found online.

Doug illustrated through his photos how the industries looked over the years, in case you wanted build a pickle industry on your layout. Also, the types of railroad cars that would be found at a pickle industry, box cars, vinegar tank cars, cucumber caring cars (cars with two kinds of tanks (coffin cars and cars with wooden casks or tanks), maybe coal cars for coal for boiler operations. You could even have a flat car delivering new processing equipment from time to time and box cars with other supplies (bags of salt, bags of spices, boxes of jars and lids, shipping materials, etc.).




# The agenda for the day is described below-.

# **April Board Meeting - Minutes**

# NMRA - NCR - Division 9 Board Meeting Minutes April 6, 2025

**Attendees:** Garry Johnson, Joel Pyard, Bob Lawrence, Alan Bau, Greg Marvin, Tony Vacha, Rich Mahaney

The Meeting was called to order by Garry Johnson at 7:06 PM

**June Membership Meeting:** Rich Mahaney presented three options for the June 21<sup>st</sup> meeting. After some discussion the board ranked these options in order for Rich to pursue. Once a final decision is reached it will be announced.

**Proposed Bylaw Changes:** Alan Bau presented several changes to our bylaws, which were discussed and approved by the board. These changes will appear in the next few issues of the Yardmaster Newsletter and then presented to the general membership at our annual meeting in September. A copy of the proposed Bylaw Revisions is attached to these minutes.

**Website Update**: Alan Bau presented a general list of topics to be included in our new website. As each section is created it will be provided to the board members for review prior to being added to the website. These include the Home Page, Member Meeting Information, Overview of upcoming Events, Yardmaster Newsletter, Links to other websites, Membership Meeting Minutes, Board Meeting Minutes, and a Contact Us Page. A comment was made that it is the Board's responsibility to create the information for the website and pass this on to Tony for posting.

**Electronic Communications**: Tony Vacha presented an overview of our direction in replacing Zoom. There will be a test of the new system on Saturday April12th at 7:00PM.

**Audio/Visual Equipment:** Joel Pyard made a proposal that we investigate purchasing certain pieces of audio/visual equipment. Tony Vacha agreed to look into this and bring a proposal back to the Board.

**Legal Status**: Bob Lawrence reviewed his extensive research project to verify that Division 9 is a non-for-profit business having a 501C3 status.

**Working Groups:** Alan Bau informed the group that he and Bob Lawrence had a meeting to work on modifying our bylaws to accommodate a few changes taking place in Division 9. We met for over an hour and made the necessary changes to present to the board for approval. Working in a small group can be very effective as there are fewer distractions and people involved are more likely to participate. We concluded that setting up a few small working groups in division 9 could be a worthwhile program. The board approved setting up three small working groups, with all board members expressing an interest in participating in one or more of these groups. A more detailed program will be developed, distributed to the board members for their review and hopefully included in the next newsletter. The initial Groups are 1 - Recruiting new members, 2- Member Retention & Participation and 3- Fund Raising

**Newsletter Advertising:** During our discussions, a question was raised concerning the possibility of local area hobby shops advertising in the Yardmaster Newsletter. Bob Lawrence and Greg Marvin agreed to investigate.

**Treasury Report:** Bob Lawrence reported that our treasury balance is \$1,138.72.

### **Proposed Bylaw Changes**

There were a few changes to the Division 9 bylaws presented to and approved by the Board during the April Board Meeting held on April 6<sup>th</sup>. The changes are displayed below for other members to review and comment. Additions or changes are displayed in red, and any items being deleted are also displayed in red but are crossed out. The numbering sequence will be updated in the next issue. The plan is to display the entire bylaws in the June Yardmaster Newsletter. We will be posting the entire set of bylaws on our website in the near future. The link to our website is <a href="https://div9.ncrnmra.org">https://div9.ncrnmra.org</a>.

The most significant changes affect the Paymaster and the newly created Webmaster position.

These changes will be voted upon at the September Annual Membership Meeting, which will be held at the Kalamazoo Bridge Club on Saturday September 20, 2025.

#### **ARTICLE IV - DIVISION BUSINESS**

- 4.3.1.2.1 One Nominee for one or more positions.
  - In the event there is only one nominee for one or more positions, a motion can be made from the floor to unanimously elect the member(s) to the position for which they are nominated.

#### Article V - Officers

- 5.1 All officers and directors shall be elected from the Division Nine general membership in good standing.
- 5.2 Election of the Officers and Board of Directors shall be at the annual meeting held each September except for the initial election to be held at the organization meeting.
- 5.3 The term of office or officers and directors shall be two years, with the exception of the Paymaster and Website Manager, which shall be ongoing as long as these members remain in good standing in Division Nine as long as they wish to serve.
- 5.4 The Paymaster and the Website Manager will be appointed by the other members of the Board.
- 5.3.1 To provide for continuity of leadership the Board shall serve on a rotating term.

5.3.1.1 Upon adoption of these by laws a special election shall be held for all officers.

The inaugural Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent, Scribe, and one the two Trustees shall hold office for two years. The Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent will be elected on alternate years, the same applies to the Two Trustees. Starting in 2025 the Superintendent, the Scribe and one of Trustee will be elected, then in 2026 the Assistant Superintendent and the other Trustee will be elected. This rotation will then apply to subsequent years.

The Inaugural Assistant Superintendent, Paymaster, and one Trustee shall hold office for one year.

#### 5.5.4 Paymaster

- a. shall oversee financial business of the Division, to include, but not limited to, collection of monies, distribution of monies as approved by the Board.
  b. shall maintain the financial records of the Division, which include but not limited to the following:
  - i. reimburse members for their out-of-pocket expenses that have been pre-approved by the Board of Directors and make payments to outside concerns for items that have been pre-approved by the Board of Directors. In the event an expense has been submitted for reimbursement that exceeds the amount approved by the Board of Directors by \$25 or more, the Superintendent or the Assistant Superintendent must approve the item for payment in writing.
  - ii. maintain the Division Nine books of account and provide a financial statement to the Board of Directors at each Board Meeting.
  - iii. submit a financial report for the monthly Division Nine Newsletter.
  - iv. The Paymaster is authorized to sign checks for approved expenditures. In the event the Paymaster is absent or unable to sign a check, the Superintendent or the Assistant Superintendent is authorized to sign checks.
  - v. The Paymaster is the primary contact between Division Nine and any approved Financial Institution that is or may be doing business with Division Nine.

c. shall ensure all financial reporting paperwork is filed with State, Municipal, and Federal agencies as required by law.

d. in the event that the Division needs a checking account, the treasurer shall establish such account, and each check must be signed by the Paymaster and the Superintendent to be valid. One additional Director shall be on the account to sign checks in the event that either the Superintendent or Paymaster is unable to sign a required check.

#### 5.5.6 Website Manager

- a. shall be responsible for creating and maintaining the Division Nine website.
- b. shall be responsible for maintaining communication links for all Division Nine meetings when appropriate.

#### 5.5.7 Newsletter Editor

a. shall be responsible for creating, editing and publishing the Yardmaster Newsletter.

#### **Board Member Elections:**

There are three board positions where their current term will expire in September 2025. These positions, along with the incumbent's name and their current list of responsibilities, are listed below: If anyone would like to join our board, please advise any of the current board members that you would like to run for a specific position at the upcoming annual meeting in September 2025.

#### **Superintendent - Garry Johnson**

- 5.5 The Board of Directors shall consist of
  - 5.5.1 Superintendent
    - a. shall be responsible for the administrative and business functions of the Division.
    - b. shall serve as liaison to the NCR, the NMRA, and other NCR divisions, modeling clubs, museums, and the non-modeling members of the community. As said liaison, shall work with the Scribe in publishing information about the Division.
    - c. the Superintendent shall be the only one authorized to make public statements without the approval of the Board.
    - d. shall serve as legal compliance officer, ensuring Division compliance with all Federal, State, Municipal, NMRA and NCR laws, rules and regulations.
    - e. shall serve as chair of Division functions, conducting all meetings in adherence with The Standard Code of Parliamentary Procedure, Fourth Edition.

#### Scribe - Alan Bau


- 5.5.3 Scribe
  - a. shall take and distribute meeting minutes.
  - b. shall maintain an archive of all official records for the Division.
  - c. shall work with the Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent in preparing and distributing information to the general membership, other Divisions, NCR North Central Region, the general public, and others as needed.
  - d. shall provide information on candidates for the available Directorships to the general membership no less than thirty days prior to the election.
  - e. shall notify members of meetings and activities
  - f. shall maintain the membership list for the Division

#### **Trustee - Doug VanMeter**

- 5.5.5 Trustees Two Trustees will serve on the Board of Directors
  - a. shall serve as representative at large on behalf of the membership
  - b. shall assist any other Director as needed

# **Division 9 Needs Your Help!**

Hey everybody, we can use your help. We are trying to reverse a recent trend of declining membership in Division 9. Our membership has dropped from 43 down to 31 over the last few months. Some of this may be due to long-time members not paying NMRA dues on a timely basis. Division 9 has been slowly growing each year since its inception. Even if the members that are late paying their dues bring them up-to-date, we are still losing members.



Most likely each of us can come up with reasons why this is taking place. The most important thing we need to do is determine if there are things we can do to reverse this trend.

Our plan is to establish a series of small working groups, each focusing on a specific area of concern. Each group would consist of between 2 to 5 members and would meet at a time and place of their choosing. Each of these sessions would focus on a specific area of concern and develop some ideas that they would then present to the board.

The areas to focus on at the start are identified below:

- 1. Develop programs to recruit new members.
- 2. Develop programs to improve our retention and participation rates.
- 3. Develop programs to raise funds.

Why small groups as opposed to a membership meeting. Some members are more willing to express their opinions and ideas working in a small group rather than a larger meeting. Working in small groups can be very effective and a lot of fun. For some of our newer members this could be an opportunity to get to know other members better.

We would like to recruit a minimum of 8 to 10 members, including board members, to help us in this effort.

We hope to get something started by the end of May.

## A building to model for a layout #1

I have looked at this building in Potterville, MI on the CN main line several times. Last Tuesday evening I got some photos before I had to go teach a tank car class for the Benton Twps. Fire Department. It just needs some covered hoppers to load!







#### A building to model #2, plus one photo

This building is just west of the CN yard on the southwest side of Lansing on the CN mainline. I have looked a number of times and have sat by the tracks in this area to photograph passing CN trains.

I thought it was interesting last week when I was by it to see the "bricked in" doorways where box cars would have been loaded and/or unloaded. Something or an idea to be modeled on a layout.

Also, I don't know how many of you have ever looked at the brick on the old generating plant in downtown Lansing by the convention center on the Grand River, but when the plant was built, they changed the brick color to reflect the colors of the boiler fires to heat water to make steam. Now that is a "scratch building" challenge.

The Accident Fund said the redevelopment would be "the largest adaptive reuse of a historic power plant in the state." Christman Co.'s information on the project pointed out that the exterior of the building has a number of distinctive features incorporated by Bowd-Munson, who were renowned architects of the period. These features include a stepped roofline, building and windows shaped to represent a stylized plume of fire, and exterior building colors symbolizing the combustion of coal, starting with black granite at the base, giving way to purple grey in the lower masonry, and continuing to red and yellow bricks that lighten in hue as the "flame" rises.


